In 2006 the Polly Hill Arboretum launched an innovative new native plant production program called MV Wildtype. Now, in 2013, the model program produces over 40 native species grown from locally collected seed. Under Tim Boland's leadership this model program helps landowners and conservation groups restore habitat and reconnect fragmented landscapes with native plants. It also includes efforts to assess the health of essential insect pollinators.
